Notes for JOHN DILLAVOU:

John Dillavou's childhood is yet a mystery. It is thought his father was killed by a horse's kick when John was very young. Nothing is known about his mother or who raised him. Various New Jersey and Pennsylvania records show Dillavou/Delavou/Delaveaux names earlier than 1750. His marriage record states "of Mannington township". John Dillavou began his family's migration westward about 1818, to Ohio, Indiana, and Illinois. About two years before he died, he removed to Seneca township, Nemaha County, Kansas. There is only a small, homemade stone with "J.D. - John Dillavou b. 1790" marking his burial place in the Dennis Cemetery, a small, private cemetery outside the town of Seneca, Kansas.

There are also records of the Swedish Lutheran Church in Penn's Neck, New Jersey, with references to a James and a Mathias Delavou/Dellavou, as early as 1758. These could be possible clues to our John Dillavou's ancestors, as he had sons named James and Mathias. A family tradition maintains that John's father may have been born on ship during his grandparents' emigration from France. Merrill M. Jordan always maintained, through his mother's stories, that John Dillavou's grandmother died giving birth aboard ship during the emigration and was buried at sea. There were Delavaus in the ship-building trade in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, pre-1776, who could possibly be connected.

Clinton Republic -- May 27, 1887:

"Uncle Billy Dillavou, who enlisted in the 107th Illinois Infantry long after he had passed the age when he was liable to military duty, has lately been granted a pension dating from June 30, 1865. From that date till 1884 he was allowed four dollars a month, and from 1884 it was increased to eight dollars a month. The old man will get nearly \$1200 back pension and eight dollars a month during the remaining days of his life. Uncle Billy has deposited the money in one of our city banks, and will use it sparingly to provide him the comforts of life. The old man and his boys were all in the army and made excellent soldiers."

"OLDEST RESIDENT CELEBRATES.

The oldest resident of DeWitt county celebrated his ninety-seventh birthday Tuesday, Dec. 3. His name is William Dillavou and is commonly known as Uncle Billy Dillavou. Uncle Billy is an old soldier and enlisted in the One Hundred and Seventh Illinois in 1862 and remained through the war. He is a member of Frank Lowry post and on Tuesday members of that organization called at his home in the southwest part of the city and chatted with him for awhile. His faculties are apparently as bright as ever and if his present health continues he will pass the century mark. The post remembered him with a few gifts commemorative of his anniversary."

"His Journey Is Ended -

William R. Dillavou, DeWitt County's Oldest Man, Passes to His Reward

It is rare indeed, that a man is permitted to trod the path of life for more than the allotted three score and ten, yet there are some about us who have been given this privilege. The number who reach the seventieth milestone is

comparatively limited and only occasionally do we hear of those who plod along until they border upon the century mark. But such is the case of another of DeWitt county's oldest residents who has just been called to his eternal reward.

William R. Dillavou died at his home southwest of the city, at eight o'clock Sunday evening. He was born in Salem county, New Jersey, December 3, 1810. At the age of eight years his parents emigrated westward and he had a distinct memory of the trip, seeing other emigrants cross the Allegheny mountains to Ohio. The Dillavou's first settled in Ohio and then moved to Indiana, living there about 20 years. In this state in 1830, the subject of this sketch married his first wife. They came to Illinois in 1850 and located near the town of Mt. Pleasant, now Farmer City, and two or three years they moved to Creek township, where the wife died on the old Billy Bennett farm in 1854. Four years later he married the widow, Maria Parker, with whom he lived 32 years, she dying about 1890. He married a third time in July 1892, to Mrs. James Klagg, who was born August 10, 1833. They moved to the old J.J. Robinson place just southwest of the city, which they bought on Thanksgiving day, 1905.

Mr. Dillavou was the father of seven children, five of whom are living; Nancy Ann Glenn of Clinton; Dickson Dillavou at home; Mary Jane Hughes, Seneca, Kan., John T. Dillavou, Kansas, Luther Dillavou, Iowa.

"Uncle Billy," as he familiarly known, was an old time Methodist and had been a member of that church since 1827. At his death his membership was with the M.E. Church at Weldon. In his early life he was a cobbler and often said he believed he made the first pair of shoes with pegged soles that were ever made in the country. He never had a pair of shoes until he made them for himself. There were no matches in those days, and no plows. His plowing was done with a wooden mould board which he made himself. He experienced all the hardships of the pioneers and a great deal more than many of the early settlers.

Mr. Dillavou was the oldest man in DeWitt county and also claimed the rare and honorable distinction of being the oldest living soldier of the civil war, this by virtue of the fact that he was admitted to the service of company E, 107th infantry, at the age of 52 years when the age limit was 45 years. If there were older ones they had never been heard from in this section. He served from 1862 until the close of the war. His vitality was remarkable. He could read and write with great ease almost until his last days. His writing was perfectly legible. He and his wife were often seen driving a spirited horse and were familiar figures to all.

Mr. Dillavou had been growing weaker for several days, due principally to the infirmities of age. He first complained of being ill last week, and Saturday evening it was thought he would not survive the night.

Lacking but a few months of being 99 years of his age, it was hoped he might live to round out the century.

The funeral will be held tomorrow afternoon at the M.E. church, Rev. J.A. Lucas, a former pastor of the church, but now of Lincoln, will conduct the services. The G.A.R. and W.R.C. will attend in a body. The interment will take place in Woodlawn cemetery."

"OLDEST MAN IN THE COUNTY DEAD.

William R. Dillavou, Almost a Centennarian, Claimed to Be Oldest Soldier of Rebellion, Passes Away Sunday Night.

Wm. Dillavou died at his home southwest of the city Sunday evening at 8 o'clock. His native state was New Jersey, having been born in Salem county December 3, 1810.

What changes have come during this life of almost a century; Madison the fourth president was in the second year of his first term; he was two years old when the second war with Great Britain began-the war of 1812. Three years before his birth Fulton sailed up the Hudson and 7 years before the Louisiana Purchase was made and was a lad of 5 when Jackson whipped the British at New Orleans.

He was 52 years of age in 1862 when he enlisted in Company F 107th Illinois Volunteers and served until the close of the civil war. He was possessed of wonderful vitality and could read and write until a short time before his death. His final sickness was but of a few days' duration.

When but eight years of age his parents came west, first settling in Ohio and later in Indiana where the family remained 20 years, where he married his first wife. In 1850 they came to Illinois settling near the town of Mt. Pleasant, now Farmer City, thence in 2 or 3 years to Creek township where the wife died in 1854. In 1858 he was married to Martha Parker who died in 1890. Two years later, Mrs. James Klagg [aka Clagg] became his wife, who survives him. He was the father of 7 children, five of whom are living. They are John T. Dillavou, Kansas; Luther Dillavou, Iowa; Mary Jane Hughes, Seneca, Kansas; Nancy Ann Glenn, Clinton; and Dickson living at home.

"Uncle Billy," as he was known to all, united with the M. E. Church in 1827, being identified with that church until his death, a period of 82 years, much longer than the allotted span of mortal man. His membership at the time of his death was with the Weldon church.

There was no one but earnestly hoped Mr. Dillavou might live to complete his 100 years, since he had so nearly reached it, lacking but one year, 3 months and 25 days of completing the century. His exact age is 98 years, 8 months and five days.

The funeral was held from the M. E. Church in Clinton Tuesday afternoon, Rev. J. A. Lucas of Lincoln

officiating. The pall bearers were veterans of the civil war: W. O. Rogers, Jno. M. Porter, George Homer, Robert Fields, John Craft and Allen Bess. The G. A. R. and W. R. C. attended in a body and interment was in Woodlawn cemetery."

"Death of Mrs. Maria Dillavou.

At the advanced age of seventy-six years, at her home in Creek township, the aged wife of W. R. Dillavou departed this life on the 9th inst., after a brief illness of twelve days of grippe. All of her living children were with her during her illness. She was the mother of eight children, six of whom with her aged partner survive her. Mrs. Dillavou was a native of Pennsylvania. At the age of twenty years she was married in Madison County, Ohio, to David Parker, and seven children, three girls and four boys, blessed their union. Her husband died in 1851, and in 1856 she was united in marriage with "Uncle Billy" Dillavou. One son was the fruit of this marriage. Her three daughters are married and live in this county, one being married to John T. Dillavou, another to S. W. McNier, and the third to Gordon McDeed. Aaron Parker, one of her sons was a member of Co. F, One Hundred and Seventh Illinois, and died in the service. "Uncle Billy" was a member of the same regiment, and was probably the oldest man who enlisted in this county during the year. Mrs. Dillavou was a member of the New Light Church, and lived a consistent Christian life for forty years."

"LIVED LONG PAST ALLOTTED YEARS-

Mrs. Sara Dillavou, Aged 98, Dies Following Steady Decline In Health-

Mrs. Sara Dillavou, aged 98 years, one of the oldest women in Champaign county, died at the home of her grandson, S. E. Dillavou, 305 West Washington street at 7:30 o'clock this morning of old age. She had not been ill, a general decline causing her death.

Sara Roadhamel was born four miles from Dayton, O., on April 24, 1814. She was married to John Dillavou there. They came to Illinois 1858, living in DeWitt county and later near DeLand in Piatt county. Her husband was born August 7, 1807 and died in 1861. She lived in DeLand after his death with Amos Dillavou for 20 years. She then made her home with her son, J. R. Dillavou for many years, after which she made her home with S. E. Dillavou.

The decedent was a member of the Methodist church of DeLand. She is survived by a daughter and three sons; Mrs. Minerva Lukens of Farmer City is the daughter and J. R. Dillavou of this city, John W. Dillavou of Scranton, Iowa, and Jerome Dillavou of Iowa are the sons. There are many grandchildren, among them S. E. Dillavou, Mrs. W. S. Kuhl, and John M. Dillavou of this city, E. O. Dillavou of Fairfield, Mrs. A. F. Hammersmith of Savoy, Mrs. J. H. Sackett of Danville, Walter Dillavou of White Heath, G. C. Dillavou of Wyoming, Mrs. Grace Mosier, Mrs. Dora Richards, Mrs. Mollie Powell, and John Lucans [sic] of Farmer City. There are a number of great-grandchildren.

Funeral services will be held at the Dillavou home, 305 West Washington street, Monday at 10:30 o'clock. The body will be taken to DeLand for burial."

"OBITUARY --

In this casket before us lies the remains of James Dillavou or called by his friends (Uncle Jim) was born of his parents John and Rebecca Dillavou on the 15th day of May 1825 in Greene Co., Ohio, he being the youngest of eight children, four boys and four girls, having only one brother living close to 93 years of age. While a youth his parents moved to Wayne Co., Ind. and up to manhood assisting his father in farming in summer and reaming in winter. Not having the advantage of common school education he spent his time this way up to the time of his marriage to Miss Margaret Coon which was solemnized in May 21, 1848, being 28 years of age at the time of his marriage. He lived in Randolph Co., Ind.. until the birth of his first child, in two or three years he moved near Bloomington, Ill. where he rented land and farmed a few years, then came out west on horseback in search of a home where land could be bought suitable to his means, buying the farm he still owned on Otter Creek, moved on his land (raw prairie) to make him a home on the 9th of Nov. 1855, to endure the privations and hardships of many long years in the wilds of the west, which none but old pioneers of long ago can tell. To his first marriage was born six children, three boys and three girls, one little boy dying in Ill. and one little girl in Iowa, leaving two boys and two girls. Then in a few months to add to sorrow and discomfort the wife and mother was taken on the

25th day of May 1862, leaving the youngest child only 4 months and 10 days of age without a mothers care. Then on the 14th day of Oct. 1862 he was united in marriage to Mrs. Nancy Morlan and to this union were born 8 children, 4 boys and 4 girls, only 5 of these are living 3 boys and 2 girls; one little girl (Margaret) dying in youth, one girl (Martha) at death leaving a family of her own, one son (Henry) of age at death. In the fall of 1897 he rented his old home farm and moved to Lahabra, Cal. in search of better health, not finding it suitable to his and his families health he came back and located on the farm in which he died. He has lived on the farm 3 miles from his old home over 40 years. His death occurred on the 11th of Sept. 1903, at the age of 78 yrs. 3 mo. 26 days, living in Greene Co., for over 47 years, the greater part of his life being spent in suffering with kidney and lung trouble until relief came in death. A great many years of his life or as long as he was able after coming to Iowa, was spent in looking after the interest of his township and county, helping to build and improve the same, holding many positions of trust in township and county. One thing he loved to look after was the schoolings first in private residence and as soon as possible the erection of school houses for the furtherance of education. Another in particular was the keeping of the Sabbath day and attending church in private house and as soon as a school house was built attend Church there. In the early day he wanted to hear the Gospel of Christ preached. He not only attended Church in Greene but up in Carroll Co. as well. As soon as Churches were built he attended there, in fact he was the originator of the Friends Church in Kendrick Twp. He attended church as far as his health would permit, not feeling able to harness his team and go to church, his body failing so fast, a thing he greatly lamented, be deprived of church privileges to a great extent. The last time he was permitted to attend Church was in Ralston while stopping with his son. While attending church he caught cold and was never able to attend any more. He soon was confined to the house and bed, and during each day and night, he has at different times committed his soul and spirit to the care of the Savior of men, calling come holy spirit, come with all thy quickening power to thee I commit my all. His constant prayer was that Christ might in fullness dwell. His nurse who was by his bedside for several days says that was his constant theme, "Christ all in All." He helped to build the Friends Church and was a member of the same, he said he wanted it built for the worship of Jesus Christ and him only. He knew how to share with the poor and needy for he had been there himself. All that his children, wife, physicians and friends could do, could not relieve his suffering untill death came without a struggle, closing his own eyes in peace to all his surrounding friends, as witnessed by three of his sons. His body soon will be laid away in silent earth which he gave to his township for a resting place for his family and friends. Thus can we say farewell father, farewell Uncle Jim, peace to thy ashes."

Biography-

"JAMES DILLAVOU, farmer, section 17, Kendrick Township, is one of the prominent pioneers of that township, and was born in Greene County, Ohio, May 15, 1825, son of John and Rebecca (Roberts) Dillavou, natives of New Jersey, who were the parents of eight children, of whom our subject was the youngest. When he was about twelve years of age his parents removed to Randolph County, Indiana, where he lived until twenty-five years of age. He was reared a farmer and received his education in the common schools. He was married May 21, 1848, to Miss Margaret Coon, daughter of John and Mary Coon, a native of Delaware. In 1850 Mr. Dillavou removed to McLean County, Illinois, where he resided five years, and November 9, 1855, he came to Greene County, locating on his present farm in Kendrick Township. There were about twenty-five families living in the township at that time. He first lived in a tent for some time, and his stock was sheltered in the brush. After a time he built a log cabin. He had to go forty miles to mill, and his post office was at Des Moines; the mail was frequently brought to Jefferson with an ox team. Elk were frequently found here at that time. Mr. Dillavou owns 460 acres of well-cultivated land, with good improvements. He has a comfortable house, a commodious barn and out-buildings for stock and grain. Mrs. Dillavou died May 25, 1862, leaving six children -- George, Elza, Rebecca, John, Mary and a babe; two are deceased. October 14, 1866, Mr. Dillavou was married to Mrs. Nancy Morelan, a native of Putnam County, Indiana, and daughter of William and Susan Beck. Mrs. Dillavou was the widow of Jackson Morelan and the mother of three children -- Evan, William and Jackson. By the second marriage there were eight children -- Martha, Samuel, Henry, Ira, Amos, Anice, Stacy and Margaret, deceased. Politically Mr. Dillavou is a Republican, casting his first vote for General Fremont. He has served in most of the township offices, and has served twice as county supervisor. He donated the ground for the Dillavou Cemetery, and is a liberal supporter of all worthy enterprises."

Jordan Post, though having many miles to come, none were more faithful than he, and none more than he enjoyed the comradeship of those who drunk from the same canteen, and we believe none more greatly missed the meetings after they ceased. The writer was told of the necessarily fatal bodily ailment many years ago by a physician, and has been surprised that he held off his relentless foe so long. "L. A. DILLAVOU---

Lytlyle A. Dillavou, son of Dixon and Nancy Long Dillavou, was born at Bloomington, Illinois, September 6, 1889, the youngest of eight children, five girls and three boys. Left motherless at an early age, he set out on his own when still very young.

Many of Mr. Dillavou's earlier years were spent in the insurance business, although when his health began to fail about ten years ago, he gave up insurance and made his avocation and hobby of watchmaking his vocation. He still kept active in his work even though he had again engaged in insurance during the past two years.

His vast knowledge of insurance and extensive acquaintance of men in that field, made him a valuable man in any insurance organization. At the time of his death, he was head of his own insurance agency and state organizer for a large Life Insurance Company. He was also associated with the Old Line Mutual and the Pioneer Mutual Insurance Companies of Denver, in an advisory capacity and as head of the Claim Department for the Old Line.

His serious heart condition for the past several years, often caused spells of illness, but his ambition was never affected, and he worked incessantly until his death, which occurred only two days after Mrs. Dillavou had returned to Denver from a visit with her father, Ira Soop, in Sanborn, Iowa. They enjoyed this one day together, visiting until late in the night since there seemed to be so many things to talk about, but early Friday morning, he suffered a heart attack which caused his death.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Florence Dillavou of Denver, whom he married in Sanborn, June 16, 1929; by four sisters, three of whom reside in Illinois and one in old Mexico; by his brothers' families in California and other distant places; and by scores of friends and business associates who deeply mourn his passing, for he was a loving husband and brother, a true friend and a valuable business associate.

None of his family and only a few friends were able to get to Sanborn to attend his funeral but they sent many beautiful flowers as a parting tribute to one whose place can never be filled. One of his friends, stunned by his sudden death, expressed what was felt by all - " Goodbye, Dill. Wherever you go, that place will be a better place for your being there."

Mr. Dillavou lived in Sanborn, Iowa, for a very short time about ten years ago, being engaged in insurance at that time.

Funeral arrangements were made by the Olinger Mortuary at Speer Boulevard and Shurman, Denver, Colorado. The body was returned to Sanborn for burial, services being conducted by Rev. Sterling J. Baldwin, at the Sanborn Funeral Home, Monday afternoon at two o'clock, November 5, 1951. Interment was made in Roseland Cemetery.

Two solos, "The Old Rugged Cross" and "Near to the Heart of God" were beautifully sung by Mrs. Harold Saupa, with musical accompaniment by Leah Smock.

Casket bearers were: M. A. Nietzsche, Forrest Watters, Robert Whalen, Donald Irving, William Behan and V.C. Powers.

Out-of-town relatives who attended the services were Mr. and Mrs. Duane Linder and Mrs. Robert Hanson of Hartley, Iowa, and Mrs. Ivan Masson of Marathan, Iowa. A number of friends from Spencer, Spirit Lake and other nearby towns who could not attend the services on Monday, paid their last respects on Sunday.

Lytlyle Dillavou, or Dill, as his friends referred to him, was deeply religious, although he made no such claims. His business dealings were always conducted along the teaching of the Golden Rule, he believed in treating others only as he himself would like to be treated, with honesty and fairness, and like Abu Ben Adhem he loved his fellowmen."

Miss Jemima Morgan, aged 66 years and a sister of Amos W. With Sherman to Sea

Only one Veteran of the War of the Rebellion now remaining in Glidden.

Luther Short a Veteran of the Civil War and a resident of Glidden for the past 39 years died at St. Anthony's Hospital in Carroll yesterday morning at 5:00. He had been ill for a week but was able to be about the house a few days before his death. He became worse on Thursday and was taken to the hospital in an ambulance. An operation was performed Tuesday afternoon for a rupture that had caused obstruction of the bowels. His age and serious condition made his recovery impossible and he died the next morning. With the passing of Mr. Short, there remains only one Civil War Veteran in Glidden, Samuel Myers. Mr. Short was always active in the G.A.R. work, and had a right to feel proud of his war record. He served during the greater part of the War and was with Sherman on his march to the sea. Mr. Short has long been a part of the active life of this community. He was intensely patriotic, and his love of country manifested itself in the way he always worked to make Memorial Day and other patriotic occasions a success. Mr. Short was 78 years, 6 months and 3 days of age at the time of his death. He had always been a strong, robust man of good health.

Luther S. Short was the son of William and Gemima [sic] Short, and was born in Randolph county, Indiana, on October 26, 1845. He came to Carroll County by ox team in 1856 and lived on a farm until 1864, when he enlisted in the Union Army for three years or the duration of the War. He was a recruit in the 39th IA Infantry, Co. E. When the 39th was mustered out he was transferred to the 7th Iowa until the close of the war. He was mustered out on July 2, 1865, at Louisville, Kentucky. He was united in marriage to Nancy A. Shreve May 26, 1866. Had he lived until the 26th of this month they would have been married 58 years. To this union there were born seven children, four boys and three girls, of whom two boys and two girls are living, O. E. Short of Paton; Mrs. E. V. Westover and George M. Short of White Sulfer Springs, Montana and Mrs. Ethel Wright of Seattle, Washington. There also remains six grandchildren, two gr-grandchildren, and one son-in-law Willis Barber."

Nancy Armilda Shreve was born August 20, 1848 in Champaign County Illinois and died February 19, 1926 at her home in Glidden, Iowa, aged 77 years, 5 months and 30 days.

Evidently she had been looking up references and her last Bible reference had led her to the book of Revelation; the book that has more to say about the other world to which she was so soon to enter than any other book in the Bible. The Program was found between the sixth and seventh chapters of Revelation and between the folds of the program was found written with lead pencil the verse of scripture which she intended to read at the Missionary meeting that afternoon. The verse is found in St. John and reads as follows; verily, verily, I say unto you, the hour is coming, and now is, when the dead shall hear the voice of the son of God and they that hear shall live. But, before she could read that verse of Scripture at the meeting that afternoon she had join the great multitude that no man can number; of whom, no doubt; she had been reading in the seventh chapter of Revelation.

Mrs. Short's death was unexpected, though advanced in years. She was enjoying her usual health, and no one thought the end being so near, she simply fell asleep in Jesus, like an infant in his mother's arms.

Mrs. Short was a charter member of the W. R. C. and of the W. C. T. U. of Glidden. She was a member of the Kensington Club, and attended and took part in the meeting of the club held week ago today at the home of Mrs. Kidney.

She leaves to mourn her loss four children Mrs. E. V. Westover of White Sulphur Springs, Montana; Mrs. Ethel Wright of Seattle, Washington; O. E. Short of Paton, Iowa; and George W. Short of Glidden, Ia. Also one brother, Henry Shreve of Del Norte, Colorado; three sisters; Mrs. Susan J. Pinor and Mrs. Sarah Goodnight of Bellingham, Washington; Mrs. Julia Sprague of Adaza, Iowa; six grandchildren and three great grandchildren.

She was the daughter of William and Jemima Short and wife of Jacob W. Ford. She was born March 19th, A.D., 1850, Died January 19th A.D. 1912, aged 61 years and 10 months. The subject of this obituary was born in Randolph county, Indiana.

At the age of four years she was deprived of a mother and a mother's care. With her father, five brothers and one sister they moved to Carroll county, Iowa, in the year 1856, which has virtually been her home ever since. Not many years after coming to Carroll county, her only sister older than she, was taken by death. These two being the only girls in the family.

In November of that year her father was united in marriage to Emeline Waldron.

In March 19th 1865 Rebecca E. Ford was united in marriage to Jacob W. "JACOB WESLEY FORD-

Jacob Wesley Ford, who is one of the most industrious and reliable citizens of Glidden where he has made his home for thirty-three years, is a native of the Buckeye state. He was born in Wayne county, Ohio, May 14, 1841, a son of Michael and Rebecca (Van Houten) Ford, both of whom were born in Pennsylvania, the former in 1805, and the latter in 1808.

The father removed with his parents to Ohio in 1812, the family locating in Wayne county. Many years afterward his father enlisted in the Mexican war and lost his life while in Mexico. In the family of Mr. and Mrs. Ford were three children: Jacob, Michael and Esther. The mother of these children lived with her son Michael until her death, which occurred in 1853. She was the youngest child and only daughter of John and Mary Van Houten, natives of Pennsylvania, who also had one son, John Van Houten. The father of these children having died, the mother was married to Jacob Snyder and to this union four children were born: Michael, Jeremiah, Mary and Levina. Michael Ford was married and in his family were eleven children, namely: John V., Rachel, William A., Katherine, Alfred, Philip, Jacob, Mary Jane, Jeremiah, Levina and Hester Ann. Five of these children are still living.

Jacob Wesley Ford came with his parents to Washington county, Iowa, in 1851, at the age of ten years. He was educated in the district schools of Washington and Greene counties and continued on the home farm until he was twenty-four years of age. He then rented fifty acres of land on which he lived for ten years, when he went to Kansas and spent three years in the Sunflower state. At the end of the time named he returned to Carroll county and took up his residence at Glidden where he has since lived. He began in the wagon-making and blacksmithing business at Glidden thirty-three years ago and continued in both lines without interruption until 1909, when his son Luther took charge of the blacksmith shop, the father carrying on the wagon-making establishment. He possesses good mechanical skill and has been recognized for many years as one of the most capable mechanics in the county.

Eight children were born to Mr. and Mrs. Ford, namely: Ermina E., who is deceased; Armilda A., now Mrs. F. W. Boswell, and who has two sons, Guy and Harry; Addie A., who married C. E. Grey and is the mother of six children, Frank E., Byron W., Goldie, deceased, Hazel E., Harold C. and George A.; Lavina E., the fourth child of Mr. and Mrs. Ford, is the wife of T. M. Johnson and the mother of one child, Frederick W.; John C. is married and has four children, Wilber L., Adelbert, Gladys and Ira; Luther is now in charge of the blacksmith shop long conducted by his father; Herbert P. is married and in his family were two children, Elva, and one who died in infancy; Susannah M., the youngest of the children of Mr. and Mrs. Ford, is the wife of F. M. Chandler.

Mr. Ford is not a member of any religious denomination but his wife is connected with the Church of God. He gives his adherence to the republican party, being a firm believer in its principles as conducive to the best interests of the state and nation. He and his wife are highly esteemed and their home is a welcome gathering place for friends and acquaintances. Mr. Ford has through life been controlled by a worthy ambition to make himself a worthy member of the community and his ambition has in a large measure been realized. At the age of three score and ten years he is still actively employed and his friends trust that he may continue for many years in the enjoyment of health and prosperity."

In the spring of 1876 he moved to Greene county, Iowa where he has since resided.

The particulars of his death are as follows. On the Friday afternoon of the day he died he, with his son Charlie, started in a buggy to Scranton. Not feeling well during the day he concluded to see Dr. Arthur. After driving from home to what is know as the John Brock farm they were called by a party of men who were erecting a new wheel over a tower at that place, to come in and assist them for a little while in raising the wheel, which they did, in fact helping till almost sunset. When getting into the buggy again they had hardly started when Charlie began calling for help. The men ran down to where the boy had stopped the team, but only one of the three got there before Mr.

Dillavou's life was extinct. Dr. Arthur was immediately summoned and was soon at Mr. Thompson's where the body had been taken, but said all life had been gone for some little time, pronouncing the trouble apoplexy. The body was taken home that night and laid away in the Dillavou cemetery the following Monday.

Rev. Wolfe of Churdan assisted by Rev. Fitch of Kendrick, conducted the services, taking for the base of their remarks the words "Blessed are they who die in the Lord." The attendance at the funeral, which was held at the Friends' church, was very large, showing the esteem in which he was held by those who knew him best.

Deceased had been for many years an earnest, conscientious Christian, who now has gone to enjoy his reward and more fully understand God's love.

Annie Electa Dillavou, daughter of Charles and Lucinda Baggs, was born in Connecticut August 3rd, 1848; died at the farm home of her son Fred, north of Scranton, Iowa, January 28th, 1935. Aged 86 years, 5 months and 25 days.

She came by boat to Chicago up the St. Lawrence river and across the great lakes when quite young, making her home in Piatt county, Illinois, where she was married to Robert G. Dillavou, Oct. 31st, 1867.

They moved from Illinois to Iowa in 1876, and their first home was in Bristol township, Greene county, just south of the farm home which they afterwards purchased and where they lived on the remainder of their married life.

The father and husband died in 1902.

She was the mother of six children, Oliver Addison, Wilbert Jerome, Charles Clarence, Rosalba Edna, Bertha and Fred B., four of whom preceded her in death, two dying in infancy. Those who survive her are two sons, Wilbert of Churdan and Fred of Scranton; she leaves also nine grandchildren, nine great grandchildren and a half-brother, William H, Baggs of Santa Anna, California.

She was the oldest member of a well known family of Dillavou's who have resided in this community for over half a century sharing in the hardships and tasting some of the joys.

Although frail in appearance, she was energetic and ambitious to a degree and this no doubt contributed much to her being able to come so near the century mark.

"Body of Scranton Man Found on Oklahoma Road --

Charles Clarence Dillavou, son of Robert G. and Annie Dillavou, was born on a farm near Maroa, Macon County, IL October 10, 1873 and departed this life near Chelsea, OK, July 7, 1934 aged 60 years 8 months and 27 days.

He moved to Iowa with his parents when but two years old and while he has resided in Iowa during most of the time since then, he has traveled extensively in the west going as far as California. In 1903 he went on a motor trip through the Dakotas, Minnesota, Nebraska, and Oklahoma. He resided in Muskogee, OK for nine years at one time.

He left here about a month ago and had only been heard from once, when word came that his body had been found early Saturday morning, the 7th of July, at the side of highway No. 66 near Chelsea, OK, where it evidently had been thrown when struck by a passing automobile. It is believed he traveled after night to avoid the intense heat of the day. He had been seen on the streets the evening preceding the accident.

He was one of a family of six children, two of whom survive him, Wilbert J. and Fred both of Scranton, and his aged mother who is now in her 85th year.

"PAST AND PRESENT OF GREENE COUNTY HISTORY - 1907

JOHN W. DILLAVOU--

John W. Dillavou has justly won the proud American title of the self-made man, for at the early age of twelve years he began earning his own living. Work-earnest, persistent work-constitutes the foundation upon which he has built his prosperity and his example may well serve as a source of inspiration and encouragement to others, showing what may be accomplished when one has the will to dare and to do. He now has an excellent farm of one hundred and sixty acres of section 13 Kendrick township, and in all particulars it is well improved.

Mr. Dillavou is a native of Indiana, his birth having occurred in Randolph county, on the 21st of April, 1849. His father, John Dillavou, was born in the Empire state in 1815 and was reared to manhood in New York. He then removed to Pennsylvania, where he formed the acquaintance of Miss Sarah E. Rhodehammel, whose hand he sought in marriage. She was born on the 24th of April, 1815. Soon after their marriage they removed to Pickaway county, Ohio, and subsequently took up their abode at Hagerstown, Indiana, where they lived until becoming residents of Dewitt county, Illinois. There Mr. Dillavou purchased land and developed a farm, which he continued to cultivate until his death. He passed away in 1867, while the mother is still living, now making her home in Champaign, Illinois. Of their family of eight children, four have passed away, while those still living are: Jacob R., also a resident of Champaign; John W., whose name introduces this record; Jerome, who is living in Glidden, Iowa; and Mrs. Minerva Lukens, of Farmer City, Illinois.

John W. Dillavou was reared to farm life. His advantages in youth were limited, for at the early age of twelve years he started out to provide for his own livelihood. He worked at farm labor, his wages being increased as his years and strength enabled him to perform more and more of the labor usually allotted to a man upon the farm. He early came to realize how valuable an asset are industry and perseverance in achieving success, and these qualities have characterized him throughout his entire life.

It was in 1876, in Illinois, that Mr. Dillavou was united in marriage to Miss Mary E. Chaney, who was born in Mason county, that state, on the 21st of April, 1854, and is a daughter of Granville and Julia (Smylie) Chaney. Her father was born August 2, 1834, in Tennessee, and the mother's birth occurred in Missouri, on the 16th of September, 1828. They became early residents of Mason county, Illinois, where Mr. Chaney followed the occupation of farming, owning a tract of land which he cultivated until he sold out preparatory to removing to Dewitt county, that state. In the latter county he also purchased land, which he continued to develop and improve until his life's labors were ended in death in the year 1875. His widow still survives him and now makes her home in the city of Dewitt. By her marriage she became the mother of nine children, of whom six are yet living: James, who resides in Wichita, Kansas; Martha Kelley, living Weldon, Illinois; Mrs. Ellen Taylor, also of Dewitt; Mrs. Neona Taylor, whose home is in Weldon; Mrs. Dillavou; and C. W., who is living in Greene county, Iowa. Unto Mr. and Mrs. Dillavou have been born ten children, who in order of birth are as follows: Lillian F., the wife of Charles Dresback, a resident of Deland, Illinois, by whom she has one child, Howard; Cora, the wife of Charles Mosteller, a farmer of Kendrick township, by whom she has one son, Roy; Mabel, who married Edwin Westbrook, now in the employ of the government in the Philippine Islands; James, who married Mina Downing, by whom he has two children, Byrel and Claude, their home being in Kendrick township; Laura, the wife of Chaunce Stream, a resident farmer of Bristol township, by whom she has one daughter, Levina; and Warren, Myrtle, Ethel G., Floyd and Virgil, all yet at home.

The family residence is pleasantly located in the midst of an excellent farm and near by are good substantial buildings for the shelter of grain and stock. A fine grove has been set out by Mr. Dillavou and adds to the value and attractive appearance of the place. The fields are well tilled and everything about the farm is indicative of the careful supervision and progressive spirit of the owner. He is systematic in his work, progressive in his plans and practical in his methods.

His business therefore is attended with a gratifying measure of success and he has thus become one of the substantial residents of the county.

Mr. Dillavou is a republican in his political views, though the honors and emoluments of office have no attraction for him. He is a stalwart defender of the party principles, which he always supports by his ballot at the polls. His fellow townsmen, however, recognizing his worth and ability, have demanded his services in public office and for eighteen years he was a justice of the peace, discharging his duties with promptness and fidelity, his decisions being strictly fair and impartial, so that he won high encomiums from all law-abiding citizens. He was also road supervisor for several years, assessor for two years, and census enumerator in 1900. He is a member of the Baptist church, which the family also attends and in the work of which they are much interested. Since 1891 he has been a member of the Odd Fellows lodge at Scranton and is loyal to its spirit of beneficence and helpfulness. No trust reposed in him has ever been betrayed in the slightest degree. On the contrary he is always faithful to the duties and obligations of citizenship, of business and of private life, and wherever he is known he is greatly respected."

"DEATH OF A GOOD MAN--

JOHN W. DILLAVOU, SCRANTON--

Old Timer of West Side Passed Away Saturday After Illness of a Week.

The death of John W. Dillavou, of Scranton, last Saturday forenoon, was a cause of great mourning in countless households in Greene county. The Bee folks are not the least to sorrow, for Mr. Dillavou was almost a lifelong friend of this paper and its editors. For many years he was Scranton correspondent to this paper, and to say he was the best of our staff, at the time is to state it mildly. Since laying down the pen for The Bee the links of friendship continued to be forged stronger than ever. It was rare that he visited Jefferson that he did not stop in to chat with the editor, and his was always a cheerful and interesting call. So, saying goodbye to this worthy citizen, is one of the deepest regrets of The Bee force.

The funeral for this honored citizen will occur this Wednesday afternoon at 2:30 o'clock, at the M. E. church in Scranton, and the Masonic Lodge will conduct ritualistic services at the graveside.

Mr. Dillavou was born in Randolph county, Indiana, on April 21, 1848, being past 81 years of age. He was one of eight children born to John and Sarah Dillavou, who during their lifetimes resided in New York, Pennsylvania, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. His father died in 1867, and the mother continued to make her home in Illinois until her death.

John was wedded to Miss Mary E. Chaney, of Mason county, Illinois, in 1875, and they came to Jefferson the same year, and settled upon the A. R. Mills farm, now the Cox land, just north of the city. There they resided five years, when Mr. Dillavou purchased the home farm in Kendrick township, to which they moved in 1881. Ten children were born to them, who with their mother, now mourn for the departed. The children are:

Mr. and Mrs. Dillavou were active members of the Kendrick Baptist church, taking a large part in the fine work of this congregation in that part of the county. Mr. Dillavou was also a member of the I.O.O.F. lodge and of the Masonic order. He filled many township offices, including Justice of the Peace, where he served his constituency for nearly 20 years, and likewise the office of assessor in Kendrick.

About twenty years ago they retired from active farming pursuits and purchased a home in Scranton, where they have enjoyed the afternoon of life, and the association of hosts of friends and neighbors.

One of the memorable occasions in the life of Mr. and Mrs. Dillavou was the celebration of their Golden Wedding anniversary which they observed on November 11, 1925. The day was given over to a reception to the people of Scranton and vicinity, and a warm hearted welcome greeted every comer. A picture was taken at the time, and published in this paper, appears again upon this page.

All his children will be at the final rites this afternoon. Mrs. Westbrook came from California last evening. Mrs. Dresback and her family arrived Sunday evening, being accompanied here from St. Louis, Michigan, by Mr. and Mrs. Morain and children, who had gone upon a trip thru the Great Lakes country two weeks ago, and who arrived at St. Louis the day the telegram reached Mrs. Dresback of the Father's sudden death."

Another Pioneer Mother Has Gone From Our Midst,

With The Passing Of Mrs. J.W. Dillavou Last Wednesday Morning--

Mrs. Dillavou was one of Scranton and Greene county's oldest Pioneers, residing in the county for over 60 years.

During all of these years she lived an honorable and upright life, being a good mother, a faithful and loving wife, a true and steadfast friend and neighbor, Scranton people saw and respected in Mrs. Dillavou all of the traits attributable to the higher plain of womanhood. Another Pioneer mother is at rest. Her labors are done, her life's duties and obligations admirably completed. But the fruits of her labors will stand as a bright moment in the years to follow.

Mary Elizabeth Chaney was born April 21, 1854, at Dewitt, Illinois, and died at her home in Scranton, Iowa, Wednesday morning June 10, 1936, at 5:00, at the age of 82 years, one month and 20 days. She lived in the home of her parents, Mr. and Mrs. Granville Chaney in Dewitt, until she was 21 years of age, when she was united in marriage to John W. Dillavou on November 11, 1875. The following spring the young couple came west into Iowa and settled in Greene county, there they spent the remainder of their lives. Their first home was on the old A.R. Mills farm, a mile north of Jefferson, where their first three children were born, and in 1882 the little family moved to the old homestead in Kendrick township. In this home seven more sons and daughters blessed the union of this pioneer man and wife. During these years Mr. and Mrs. Dillavou were faithful and dependable members of the Kendrick Baptist church of which they were charter members and in which they kept their membership until their deaths.

In 1911, having raised their family, they retired from the hard life of the farm to their Scranton residence in the north part of town, where they lived the rest of their years. Mrs. Dillavou was a member of the women's relief corp., but it was her children and grandchildren, and still later her great-grandchildren, who gave her the greatest pleasure and who received most of her attention.

She leaves her family of 10 children, 23 grandchildren and 7 great-grandchildren, who will miss her greatly. The children are; Mrs. Lillian Dresbach, of St. Louis, Mich.; Mrs. Cora Mosteller, of Jefferson; Mrs. Mabel Westbrook, of Los Angeles, Calif.; James, of Jefferson; Mrs. Laura Stream, of Churdan; Warren, of Churdan; Mrs. Myrtle Morain, of Jefferson; Mrs. Ethel Freese, of Scranton; Floyd, of Jefferson, and Virgil, of Bonderant. Funeral services were held from the Huffman Funeral Home in Scranton last Sunday afternoon, with the Rev. R.N. Hillyer, of the Jefferson Baptist church in charge, assisted by Rev. R.J. "Masonic Funeral For Pioneer Farmer And Business Man, G.C. Dillavou—

A largely attended Masonic funeral at the temple of Absarokee lodge in Powell last Friday afternoon gave honor to and opportunity for eulogy of the life of George Clarence Dillavou, who died at his farm home northwest of town on December 25, 1935, of a heart ailment. He had reached the age of 54 years and 6 months.

Rev. Wm. Fred Wills, Presbyterian pastor of Powell, was the presiding minister at this burial occasion. He preached a short, comforting sermon at the temple, and this was followed by a service at the grave in Crown Hill cemetery, as prescribed by the Masonic ritual. Relatives from a distance attending the funeral were the brother John of Chicago and a cousin, R.C. Dillavou, and wife of Billings, Montana.

Mr. Dillavou is survived by his wife, Mrs. Anna Dillavou, and by one brother John, a business man of Chicago.

For some time past Clarence Dillavou had been ill with a heart ailment. This physical infirmity came upon him six years ago, but had been particularly troublesome the past three years. For two months preceding his death, he was bedfast. At times he would rally to give hope to Mrs. Dillavou and the family physician, but a few days before his death it was realized that the end was near. He died at 2 o'clock on the afternoon of Christmas day.

Clarence Dillavou was a pioneer of the Shoshone reclamation project, he and Mrs. Dillavou having come to reside on a homestead in the Powell settlement in the year 1912. In the intervening period of nearly twenty-four years, Mr. and Mrs. Dillavou have made this farm their home, excepting a brief period in town and a residence of four years in Basin, Wyoming, where Mr. Dillavou gave his attention to a bank receivership. Probably no homesteader in the history of the Shoshone reclamation project settlement has had a more varied and useful career than Clarence Dillavou. Successful and a good manager on his own farm, he has taken a great interest in years past in the many phases of community development. He courageously contended for the interests of Shoshone project farmers in the settlement of early problems with the reclamation service. He was for a time cashier of one of the pioneer banking institutions of the community and during a brief residence

within the town of Powell was secretary of the chamber of commerce.

Outstanding in his community activities was Mr. Dillavou's interest in Absarokee Masonic lodge of which he was one of the early members. He was worshipful master of the local lodge during the year 1918. He first became a Mason in the year 1905, holding membership in the Tolono lodge No. 391 in Illinois, and he was also a member of the Champaign commandery [sic], the Danville consistory and the Medinah shrine of Chicago.

Mr. Dillavou was active in politics, being a member of the Republican party in northwestern Wyoming. He once served as county chairman.

At farmer and community gatherings, wherever matters were discussed of vital concern to the future of the Powell farming locality, Mr. Dillavou could be depended on to be present to lend his deliberate and logical voice to the discussion.

Mr. And Mrs. Dillavou have ever been valued members of the social life of the Powell community, and to Powell as well as to their neighborhood friends of the rural community north of town, the breaking up of this home and the loss of one of the public spirited and industrious citizens will bring profound regret.

A Native of Illinois—

George Clarence Dillavou was born in DeLand, Illinois, on the 16th day of June, 1881, one of three sons in the home of Amos B. and Martha Finder Dillavou. Reared and receiving his elementary schooling in his native community, he later spent some time in the halls of higher learning in Effingham and Normal, Illinois. He followed the school teaching profession in his home state of Illinois for several years. Later on he entered the farm implement business at Tolana.

It was at Tolana in 1910 that Mr. Dillavou married Anna Kelley, who resided at that place. Following their marriage, they continued for about two years at that Illinois point and then came west to the Powell, Wyoming, country.

Of Mr. Dillavou's boyhood family only the one brother John survives. His parents preceded him in death, and one brother, Walter E., died in the influenza epidemic of 1918."

GEORGE C. DILLAVOU, farmer, section 17, Kendrick Township, was born in Randolph County, Indiana, August 29, 1850, son of James Dillavou, a prominent pioneer of this county. He was five years of age when his father came to Iowa and settled amid the wild surroundings of pioneer life. His youth was spent in assisting his father on the farm, and in attending the common schools of Greene County. He was married March 13, 1879, to Miss Lotta Chase, who was a native of Canada, and a daughter of Rev. John W. Chase, a prominent minister in the United Brethren Church, and the founder of the first church of that denomination in Greene County. He was a native of Connecticut, and married Miss Susan Crawford, who was a native of Canada. They lived in Canada several years, and in 1855 came to Iowa, settling in Clayton County, where they lived until 1868, then came to

Greene County and settled in Cedar Township. Mr. Dillavou came to his present farm in the spring of 1879, which he purchased some time previous. He owns 200 acres of excellent land, and his farm is known as one of the best in his township. He has a good two-story residence built in modern style, with bay window and piazzas, and surrounded with shade trees, and his farm buildings are commodious and comfortable. He is quite extensively engaged in stock-raising and feeding. Mr. and Mrs. Dillavou have had four children- Mahlon J., Statten G.; Ross L., who died at the age of two years, ten months and fifteen days, and Maud. Politically Mr. Dillavou is a Republican. He served as township clerk when only twenty-one years of age. He has served as a member of the School Board and township assessor with satisfaction to his constituents. He well remembers seeing the deer and elk run up and down the creek on the farm of his father; seeing and hearing the prairie wolves howl when only a little boy, and at one time getting scared by the wolves, and in the place of seeing carpet-baggers and plug hats, hoops and bustles, or banged hair, he saw the hunter with his coon-skin cap and long rifle on his shoulder, and women dressed plain with long hair.

Obituary - George C. Dillavou

George C. Dillavou, son of James and Margaret Dillavou, was born August 29, 1850, in Randolph county, Indiana. At the age of two years he moved with his parents to Illinois, near Bloomington. After living there three years the family moved to Iowa in the fall of 1855 in a covered wagon, locating in Kendrick township, Greene county.

Mr. Dillavou was one of the pioneers of this section of Iowa and experienced many of the hardships and privations of pioneer days. He loved to relate some of his experiences and in order to preserve the record of his life he wrote a carefully prepared account of the same so his children and others might have the facts. This was done shortly previous to the time he was confined to his bed.

On March 13, 1879, he was united in marriage to Charlotte A. Chase Hall and on the 18th of March they began housekeeping on the farm, now occupied by his son, Statten, six miles northwest of Scranton. To this union nine children were born, five sons and four daughters, all of whom were born and reared on the farm in Kendrick township.

In the spring of 1907 he moved his family to a little farm which he purchased near Glidden. Later he moved to town, and after eight years purchased the Vader property and lived there ever since.

Mr. Dillavou was a man of high and noble principles. He was industrious and thrifty, being actively engaged in useful occupation all his life. He was devoted to his family, he was a good neighbor, he loved his country and had high regard for the Bible, the church and his God. He was always blessed with good health until about a year ago. From that time on his strength gradually failed until he peacefully passed away on Saturday afternoon, September 2, 1933, having reached the age of 83 years and 4 days. On his 83rd birthday anniversary, just four days before his passing the children and a few friends gathered around his bedside and fittingly commemorated the event. Then two days later the annual Dillavou reunion was held and he was eager to hear a report from that. It seemed his strength rapidly ebbed away after he had lived up to the time of these two events.

His wife and lifelong companion preceded him in death, as did also three of his children; his wife passing on July 9, 1929; Rossman J.; who died in infancy; Fern E., who died January 25, 1909, and Joy W., who was killed in the world war July 19, 1918. He leaves to mourn his departure six children; Malhon J., of Glidden; Statten G. of Scranton; Maude E. Whiting; of Lake City; Essie E. Allstott, also of Scranton; Wayne E., of Austin, Minnesota, and Genevra G. Davis, of Glidden; also 17 grandchildren and 10 great-grandchildren. He also leaves one brother, John of National City, California; one sister, Mary E. Baggs, of Mora, Minnesota; two half- sisters, Mrs. Martin Jordan, Mrs. Ernest Rider, and one half-brother, Amos Dillavou, all of Scranton, Iowa, besides a large circle of friends and distant relatives.

Some of his closing words in his own written account of his life which he prepared on last June 8th are as follows; "It will not be long until my name will be in this list." (he has just mentioned the names of the deceased in the family) "as I am suffering much pain in my 83rd year. You all have my thanks for your kindness and help which you have given me. May the Lord bless you is my sincere wish. I have never lost faith in the All wise Supreme Creator. My hope is an eternal reward. I know there is none other that can speak peace to a man's soul but the eternal God himself. So I trust as I fall asleep in Him, I shall rise with Him. This is my fervent prayer...You whom I leave may God bless you. Trusting and hoping that I have my part in the first Resurrection, for on "luck" the second death hath no power. This is my Prayer. Good-bye."

Funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at the M.E. church, the Rev. E.M. Buehler in charge, assisted by the Rev. Mrs. Alberry, of the Kendrick Friends church. A male quartet, consisting of W.L. McLaughlin, A.D. Smith, W.H. Genter and C.M. Roberts, sang two selections and W.H. Genter sang a solo, Mrs. Florence Sherfield presided at the organ. Interment at the Dillavou cemetery. Dillavou, in Glidden. The Bee understands this young man enlisted at the same time as did Merle Hay, of Glidden, one of the first three boys to give their lives in the country's service. Friends without number extend heartfelt sympathy to the Dillavou relatives, one and all, and particularly to his sorrowing family in this time of their grief.

In addition to the death of Joy Dillavou, this week's casualty list includes the name of Robert H. Dillavou, a cousin of Joy, who is listed as 'severely wounded.' We understand Robert also went to war at the same time as Merle Hay, and it is further stated that, of the dozen boys going at that time, all have either been killed or wounded. There are three Dillavou boys in the list from Glidden, a fine testimonial to the patriotism of this 'west side' family."

"C. Oscar FLAUDING, one of Jackson township's well known and progressive young farmers and landowners, is a native son of Jay county and has lived here all his life. Mr. FLAUDING was born on a farm in Bearcreek township, November 17, 1890, and is the son and only child of John V. and Jane Elizabeth (KESSLER) FLAUDING, the latter of whom was born in that same township, April 2, 1847, a daughter of Harmon and Sarah KESSLER, pioneers of that section of the county. The late John V. FLAUDING, who became one of Jay county's large landowners, was an European by birth but had been a resident of this country since he was fifteen years of age He was born in the kingdom of Saxony, September 18, 1838, and was the only son of George A. and Barbara (SMITH) FLAUDING, who came to America in 1854 and settled at Buffalo, N. Y. In this city John V. FLAUDING grew to manhood. In 1860, not long after attaining his majority, he married In 1866 he came to Indiana with his family and located on a farm of seventy-eight acres of timber land he had bought in Bearcreek township, this county. He proceeded to clear that land and make a farm. Mr. FLAUDING's parents accompanied him here in 1866 and both spent their last days here, his mother dying in the fall of 1874 and his father in the summer of 1877 and both are buried in Bloomfield cemetery. John V. FLAUDING also spent his last days here, his death occurring in 1909. He was twice married. His first wife, Julia Ann SOLOMON,, whom he married in Buffalo, died in this county in the summer of 1880. To that union ten children were born. On September 18, 1883, John V. City's Record In Contest Hit By Fatality

Chester L. Dillavou Succumbs After May 26 Crash.

Chester L. Dillavou, aged 54, of 701 North Main street, Mishawaka, died at 5:05 p.m. Wednesday in Mishawaka St. Joseph hospital as a result of injuries suffered in a traffic accident in South Bend May 26 and South Bend's position in the four-cornered safety contest with Gary, Evansville and Fort Wayne, Ind., was given another jolt as the competition neared the end.

Meanwhile, Coroner T.C. Goraczewski continued his investigation of two fatal traffic accidents in South Bend Tuesday. Robert E. Price, 20, of 809 South 34th street, driver of a car that figured in the death of 81-year-old John Kline, of 635 South 28th street, was put under \$1,000 coroner's bond. Price was cited for alleged reckless driving after the accident, which occurred at 30th and Hastings streets.

A police report quotes Price as having admitted that he was driving 40 miles an hour in a 30-mile-an-hour zone when his car crashed with an automobile in charge of William Kline, 39-year-old son of the fatally injured man. Police cited Mr. Kline for alleged driving without lights.

Blood Clot Caused Death-

Mr. Dillavou did not appear immediately to be seriously injured in the May 26 accident which sent two others to Epworth hospital and did not enter the Mishawaka hospital for treatment until May 28. Deputy Coroner W.

Robert Orr performed an autopsy Wednesday night and today attributed death to a blood clot reaching the lung from an injured section of the man's left leg.

The death of Mr. Dillavou raised to three the death toll in South Bend since the opening of the safety contest with the three other Hoosier cities of comparable size May 1 and raised the county's traffic death toll for the year to 23. Gary has recorded three deaths, Evansville one, and Fort Wayne none.

The collision, involving cars driven by Paul E. Metzner, 45, of 524 East Third street, Mishawaka, and Miss Alice Zellmer, 18, of 729 East Victoria street, occurred at Bronson and Rush streets. Mr. Dillavou was riding with Mr. Metzner as was Mrs. Roy B. Hobbs, 36, of 549 Lincoln Way West, Mishawaka, who is still being treated in Epworth hospital. Mr. Metzner, also injured, has been released from the hospital.

Miss Zellner, also injured, was cited by police for alleged driving of an automobile on a beginner's permit without a licensed operator in the car. In city court June 9 she received a suspension of an \$11 fine.

Studebaker Employee-

Mr. Dillavou was born near Muncie, Ind., Dec. 5, 1886, and went to Mishawaka from Bridgman, Mich., 28 years ago. He had been employed by the Studebaker corporation 36 years. At the time of his death he was a cashier.

"EARL DILLAVOU DIED OF WOUNDS SEPT. 17--

Official News Finally Received Here Which Clears Up Mystery of What Had Become of the Young Man. Another gold star can now be officially added to Glidden's service flag. A telegram received from the war department last Saturday brought the news that Private John E. Dillavou had died of wounds on Sept. 17, 1918. It took almost ten months to get the news to his parents here.

The announcement was no surprise to Earl's relatives and friends. He was officially reported as wounded Sept. 12 at St. Mihiel, at the time American troops straightened out the wedge in the line at that place with such a brilliant dash. After that, no word was received from him and all efforts to get any news were unavailing. The telegram received Saturday indicates that the wounds received on the 12th were severe ones from which he died five days later.

Earl was truly a model young man. He was born in Glidden Feb. 16, 1896, and was consequently 22 years, 7 months and 1 day old at the time of his death. His whole life has been spent here. He worked his way through the common school branches, then through the high school, and his greatest ambition before leaving for the army was to get a college education. He had a brilliant mind and a soul as conscientious and upright as ever was found in man.

The Graphic had a fine opportunity to become acquainted with this young man. For some months before he left he was an employee of this office, and it was not until last Saturday that this office gave up hope of his ever coming back. Earl hated war; he didn't believe it was Christian; yet he never hesitated a bit when his turn came to go to the front. Reports indicate that he made a good soldier and a splendid fighter. As the famous Sgt. York says, "A man can be a better soldier for his county [as] he is a good soldier for Jesus Christ." No member of the Glidden Methodist church was more faithful to his trust than he. None devoted more time to church work than he.

Not long ago The Graphic got hold of a history of the 357th infantry, of which Earl was a member. The book showed that of Earl's squad of eight, four had been killed in the St. Mihiel dash. The Graphic wrote to the other three in the hopes of getting some information concerning the young man. Only last week a reply was received from Private John T. S. Duerk, 1983 Washington Ave., New York City.

He says in part: "I myself was wounded at Fey-en-Haye Sept. 12th but I don't remember seeing John get hit. The squad went over the top under Corporal Daley. I was right near John in the line of skirmishes, the other squads of our company extending out on both sides of us. The behavior of our squad was like men, John and I were conversing occasionally, and I want to say, the Lord forbid it, still if he met his death he met it like a man. He showed no signs of excitement whatsoever. The squad was there with the nerve if I do say it myself. "After a certain period, things being too dead going straight ahead, we tried to shoot at machine guns that were shooting at us from the side. They would not however come out and fight like men. I suppose that's not their nature. I was at the extreme end of the line on the left and received a machine gun bullet in the leg and a piece of shrapnel in the hip. I rolled over into some brush after being hit and was talking to Corporal Daley. I don't remember seeing John there and if he was there possibly I was too excited to see him after getting hit myself.

"More than likely John went ahead and didn't bother with the machine guns on the flank. When a soldier goes over he uses his own judgment about the particular spot he wants to take. At all events the boys left the spot where I was hit as it was suicide to remain there. Owing to the fact that all are required to keep a skirmish line I lost track of John in the drive and he lost track of me, our own object being to kill a couple of Dutchmen before we were hit ourselves.

"John was a nice fellow, good natured, game, and a man every inch of him. I hope he turns up. In case however that he doesn't I want to say he died like a man."

Amos W. Morgan, 76, a resident of Neodesha for the past 33 years, died last Friday morning at 2 o'clock at the Wilson County hospital. Uremic poison and complications was the cause of his death, and Mr. Morgan had been in failing health for several months.

Amos William Morgan was born at Glidden, Ia., June 7, 1851 [sic], and was 76 years, 6 months and 12 days of age at his death. of it, without hope of reward. In this capacity, as in many others, she will be greatly missed.

The body arrived in Carroll early Saturday morning, accompanied by her husband, who had been with her during the week preceding her death. It was brought to Glidden, and the funeral was held at the Presbyterian church Monday afternoon. The sermon was preached by Rev. W.H. Parker, of Carroll, assisted by Rev. F. Nichol. Music was furnished by a mixed quartet consisting of Mrs. H.A. Johnson, Mrs. D.E. Waldron, J.C. Bohling and H.W. Porter. The church was filled to capacity, and the members of the D.A.R. and the Sorosis Club attended in a body. The floral offerings were exceptionally beautiful. The body was laid to rest at Westlawn.

Mrs. Barber seemed to have a premonition that she would never recover from her operation. Before leaving Glidden she set things in order as though she would never return. She left a letter addressed to Rev. W.H. Parker at Carroll, to be opened "in case the operation is not successful." In it contained the following Obituary:

Mary Catherine Short, the fourth child of Luther S. Short, and Nancy A. (Shreve) Short, was born near Fall River, Greenwood county, Kansas. Came to Greene county, Iowa, when a few weeks of age, and to Glidden in 1885.

Was converted at 12 years of age, attending the Presbyterian church, always working for the benefit of the church and Christianity. Finished the Glidden high school and two years college course. Was united in marriage to Willis Barber on Jan. 8, 1896. One child was born to this union, Vearl M., of Des Moines. Mrs. Barber was in the millner business several years in Glidden. Has been housekeeping the past eleven years. Mrs. Barber is past regent of Carroll Priscilla Alden chapter, Daughters of the American Revolution; a member of the Joan of Arc chapter of the United States Daughters of 1812, of State Center, Iowa, member of the Sorosis Federated Club, W.C.T.U. and Missionary Society and the interest in community work.

To these notes Rev. Parker added;

Mrs. Barber departed this life on June 1, 1923, leaving a mother and father, husband Willis Barber, of Glidden; and one son, well beloved Vearl M., of Des Moines; two sisters, and two brothers. She took keen interest in community affairs and was second in her zeal for Memorial and Decoration Day services to old Bro Fisher, recently deceased.

A very sad event that affected the homes of Glidden relatives was the death at White Sulphur Springs, Montana last week of Mrs. Myna Nielsen and her daughter, Mrs. Naomi Zehntner. Spanish influenza was the cause of the death. Mrs. Zehntner died at 5 o'clock last Friday evening and her mother about 9:30 Saturday morning. Mrs. L. Short, mother of Mrs. Nielsen, and Oliver Short of Auburn, a brother, left for White Sulphur Springs Saturday. The funeral was held on Tuesday.

Myna Ann Short, daughter of Luther S. and Nancy A. Short, was born in Greene county, Iowa north of Scranton, May 16, 1881. She moved to Glidden with her parents in April, 1885. She attended school here and was an active worker in the church and Christian Endeavor society. At the age of 15 she went to Denver, Col., made her home with her sister Viola and attended school. She studied music there and in 1897 returned to Glidden and took a short business course at the Glidden college.

On May 17, 1899, she was united in marriage to Reuben Kelly of Denver. One child was born to this union, Dorothea Naomi, who died the day before her mother did. In 1901 Mrs. Kelly was left a widow by the death of her husband.

With Naomi she spent the fall of 1902 and the spring of 1903 with her parents in Glidden. Dorothea Naomi Kelly, daughter of Reuben and Myna Kelly, was born in Denver, Colo., March 24, 1900, and died at her home in White Sulphur Spring, Mont., on Oct. 11, 1918, aged 18 years, 6 months and 17 days. She received most of her education in Spokane, Wash. She was united in marriage to Benjamin Zehntner of her hometown May 16, 1918, at the home of her mother. Mr. Zehntner built a new home and they went to housekeeping at once. On July 27th he was called to the colors, leaving for camp Lewis, Wash. He was at that camp only two weeks when he was sent to Camp Kearney, Calif., where he was stationed only ten days. It was the intention of the family to move from the ranch to town during the winter months. When Mrs. Zehntner reached home both she and Ethlyn were taken very sick on the night of Oct. 3rd with influenza. The next day their mother was taken ill, Mrs. Westover from Spokane and George Short, a brother whose claim is a short distance from theirs, were with them through their sickness. Mrs. Luther Short of Glidden and Oliver Short of Auburn started for the west immediately after the word was received of the deaths. The neighbors and friends made all arrangements for the funeral. The remains were laid to rest in White Sulphur Springs cemetery.

Both Mrs. Nielsen and Mrs. Zehntner were held in high esteem by all who knew them, as was evidenced by the beautiful floral offerings at the funeral. It seems doubly sad. Naomi, in her beautiful young life, taken away, with her husband in France. In all his letters he cautioned her to take care of her health, to be brave and to comfort his mother until he came back."

Albert Wilder Thompson, 95, former Dean of the College of Sciences and Arts of Washington State University, died Sept. 19 at his home in Princeton following a long illness.

Born in Harvey, Ill., he received a B.A. in foreign languages from the University of Illinois in 1922, a master's degree from Harvard in 1923, and a doctorate in Romance languages from the University of Chicago in 1929.

He taught one year at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and three and a half years at Princeton. Dr. Thompson's special field of study was Old French, and more specifically the legends of King Arthur as recorded in medieval French. In 1923 he and his new bride, Edna Sackett, honeymooned in France, and they visited Europe many times thereafter for both research and pleasure.

In 1930 he accepted a one-year appointment as assistant professor at Washington State College (now University) in Pullman “to see the West before we settled down”, and remained there for 46 years. He attained the rank of full professor in 1947, became Chairman of the Department of Foreign Languages in 1949, and later that year became chairman of the Division of Humanities with jurisdiction over several departments. He was named Dean of the College of Sciences and Arts in 1953 and remained in that position until his retirement in 1964. Even as an administrator he continued to teach one course in French literature and civilization, and to bring French films and speakers to the campus.

His students appreciated the quality and enthusiasm of his teaching, and the French government recognized his contribution to French culture in the Northwest by awarding him the *Palmes Academiques*. He initiated and taught an integrated course in the humanities, developing new course materials because no textbook yet existed.

His publications were largely in the area of medieval French literature, but he also prepared an edition of the 19th century French romantic tale “Paul et Virginie” by Bernardin de Saint-Pierre.

Upon retirement, Dr. Thompson turned his attention to the history of the Northwest, focusing in particular on the accounts of the early French Canadian explorers who had recorded their findings in Canadian French, which sometimes differed from standard French in ways that had misled earlier historians. He was fascinated by the relations among the Indians, French Catholic priests, Protestant missionaries and French Canadian fur traders. A deep sympathy with the Indians led naturally to study of their various languages and lifestyles. He and his wife traveled widely to visit locations described in early accounts, and his articles on Northwest history appeared in various historical journals.

In 1972 the oldest building on the WSU campus, a National Historical Landmark, was renamed Thompson Hall in his honor. Appropriately, this building had been constructed in 1895 in French chateau style.

He and his wife moved to Princeton in 1976 to be near their daughter, Laura Lee McClure, wife of Dr. Donald McClure, professor of chemistry at Princeton University.

Dr. Thompson was a member of Phi Beta Kappa, the Sons of the American Revolution, the Modern Language Association, the Medieval Academy of America and other professional organizations. He was a life member of the NAACP and a patron of the Princeton NAACP Legal Defense Fund.

In Princeton, he also was a member of the Nassau Club, the Old Guard, the Princeton Historical Society, the Friends of Music and the Cercle Francais. Dr. Thompson was an excellent pianist and a lifelong lover of good music.

He is survived by a daughter, Laura Lee McClure of Princeton; a son, Richard Sackett Thompson of Bethesda, Md; a sister, Elizabeth Naibert of Cedar Rapids, Iowa; six grandchildren; and one great-grandchild. A graveside service was held Sept. 20 at Princeton Cemetery, with the Rev. Wallace Alston and the Rev. Cynthia Jarvis of Nassau Presbyterian Church officiating.

"MRS. FLOYD DILLAVOU DEAD

Nothing more shocking ever occurred in this community than the very sudden death of Mrs. Floyd Dillavou, only child of Mr. and Mrs. J.J. Johnson, of Kendrick, which occurred at her home last Saturday at about one o'clock a.m. At six o'clock of the evening before Mrs. Dillavou was in her usual excellent health and the news of her death on Saturday morning came to her many friends as an overpowering blow. Shortly after six o'clock in the evening Mrs. Dillavou experienced a violent attack of cramps in the stomach, which rendered her almost immediately unconscious. A physician was speedily summoned and heroic treatment was resorted to. She responded promisingly to the treatment, apparently gaining stronger heart action and partial consciousness, but at the hour above stated heart failure produced the end.

There are no words of consolation for the grief-stricken husband, parents, grandparents and other relatives and near friends who were thus ruthlessly robbed of one whom they held very dear, as it were in an hour, save the promises of Holy Writ. Myrtle Dillavou was almost a child in years, although she had assumed the most serious responsibilities in life - wifehood and motherhood. She was born and reared and died in Kendrick township, and no daughter of this good neighborhood bore a fairer name. An only child, she had been idolized in the home of her parents, and during all her life she had been surrounded by friends. Her funeral was conducted from the Friends church in Kendrick on Sunday at 2 p.m., by Rev. J. C. Wright, who was assisted by Rev. J. E. Hartsuck. One of the largest congregations that ever gathered at this church was present - a marked token of esteem for both the living and the dead. The entire community was moved by a common chord of deepest sympathy. Following the funeral services the remains were tenderly laid to rest in the Dillavou cemetery. The pall bearers were selected from her classmates and associates and were as follows: Lloyd and Claude Eason, Harold and Maxwell Greene, Russell Christian and Walter Hawley. The floral offering on this occasion was extremely rare and profuse. The following obituary notice and biographical sketch was read at the funeral:

"LES DILLAVOU—

Les Dillavou was not your average salesman. A generation ago he went from office to office in Santa Rosa peddling candy, never letting his blindness hurt his salesmanship.

Dillavou, 85, who died July 27 at a Santa Rosa hospital, recalled in an interview five years ago that "I had an advantage. I had a beautiful guide dog and she did the selling."

Dillavou was a former semi-professional baseball player who lost his vision at the age of 19 when a country doctor put the wrong solution in his eyes while treating an eye infection.

The Iowa native loved to work and never let his blindness constrain him. "He used to talk to other people who were going blind and explain to them it wasn't the end of the world. He had a real good attitude about that," said his daughter, Helen Sylvia of Windsor.

Dillavou did telemarketing work at a Petaluma roofing company, and also for Post-Newsweek Cable in Santa

Rosa. When World War II began, he went to work on the assembly line at Lockheed in Southern California where the company took on 13 blind people as a trial. By war's end, there were 300 blind people working there. After the war, Dillavou bought a Nash Rambler and a guide dog, hired a driver and set off to sell janitorial supplies throughout greater Los Angeles. He also sold greeting cards, worked in a laundry and set up bowling pins. In the late 1960s, he and his wife, Gussie, moved to Santa Rosa to be closer to their daughter and her children. In Santa Rosa, Dillavou switched to selling candy at offices and stores. "Scranton Girl And Fiancé, Young Bagley Couple Perish In Flash Flood Last Tuesday-
15 Others Die As Waters Rise-

Miss Camille Buckner, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Virgil Buckner of Kendrick township, was one of 19 victims of a flash flood in the Audubon-Hamlin-Exira area last Tuesday night.

Miss Buckner was 21 years old. Her engagement to Max Cornish, son of Mr. and Mrs. Maurice Cornish of Bagley, had been announced this spring. Her fiancé and Mr. and Mrs. Clyde Carrick of Bagley also perished in the flood. The four young people apparently left their car at Hamlin and were swept away by the swift moving waters. Almost 13 inches of rain fell in that area, changing the Nishnabotna river from a peaceful stream to a raging and devastating torrent two miles wide at some points.

The tragedy shocked the Scranton and Bagley communities and the entire area. Huge crowds attended the funerals as a small token of respect and sympathy for the bereaved families.
